Outline

This is a graduate level course in economics. We will examine topics (and their economic applications) including finite-dimensional optimization, difference equations, fixed point theorems, and/or dynamic programming. The goal of this course is to prepare you for the mathematically demanding Ph.D. core courses in economics.

- Rudin, Principles of Mathematical Analysis

3. Linear Algebra
4. Fixed Point Theorems & Applications
5. Dynamic Optimization
